The survey was carried out during the period 23 March to 06 April 2020. The combined turnover of fully responding label companies is approximately £340 million in businesses employing around 5,000 people.

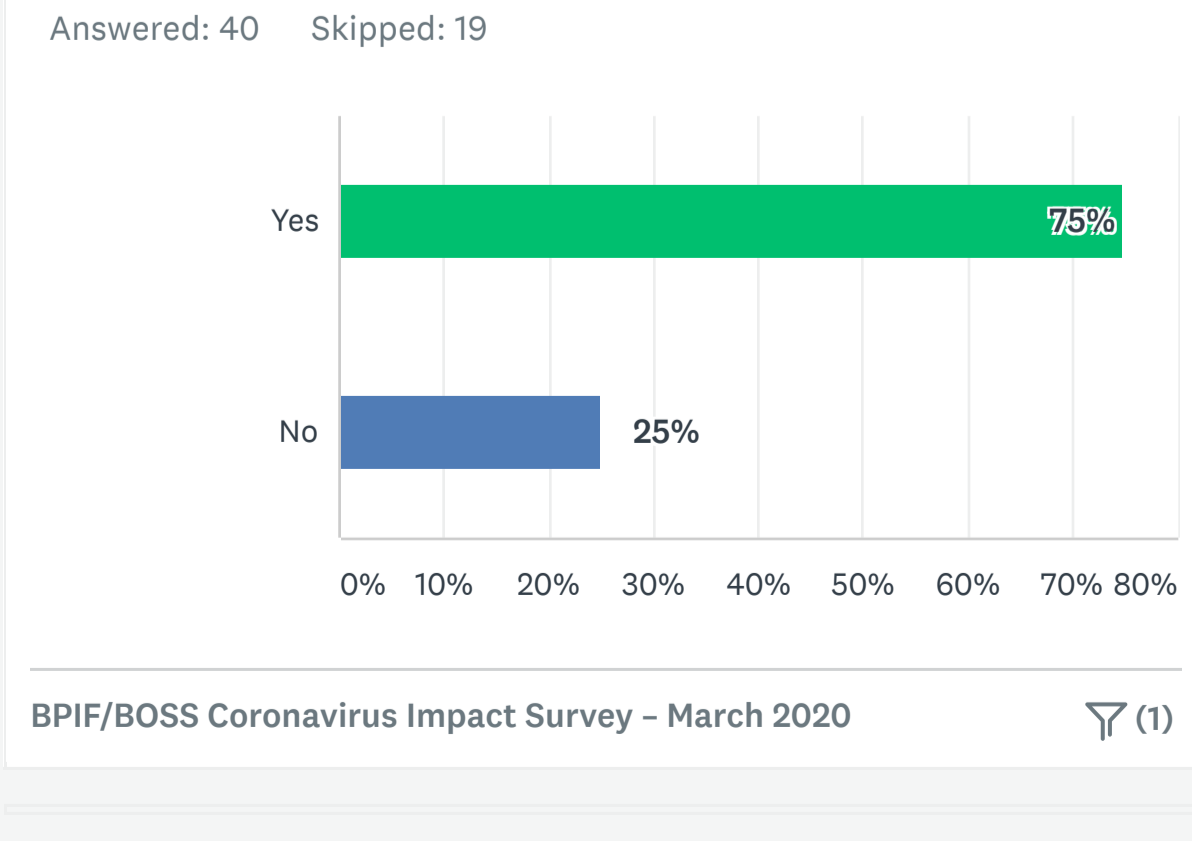
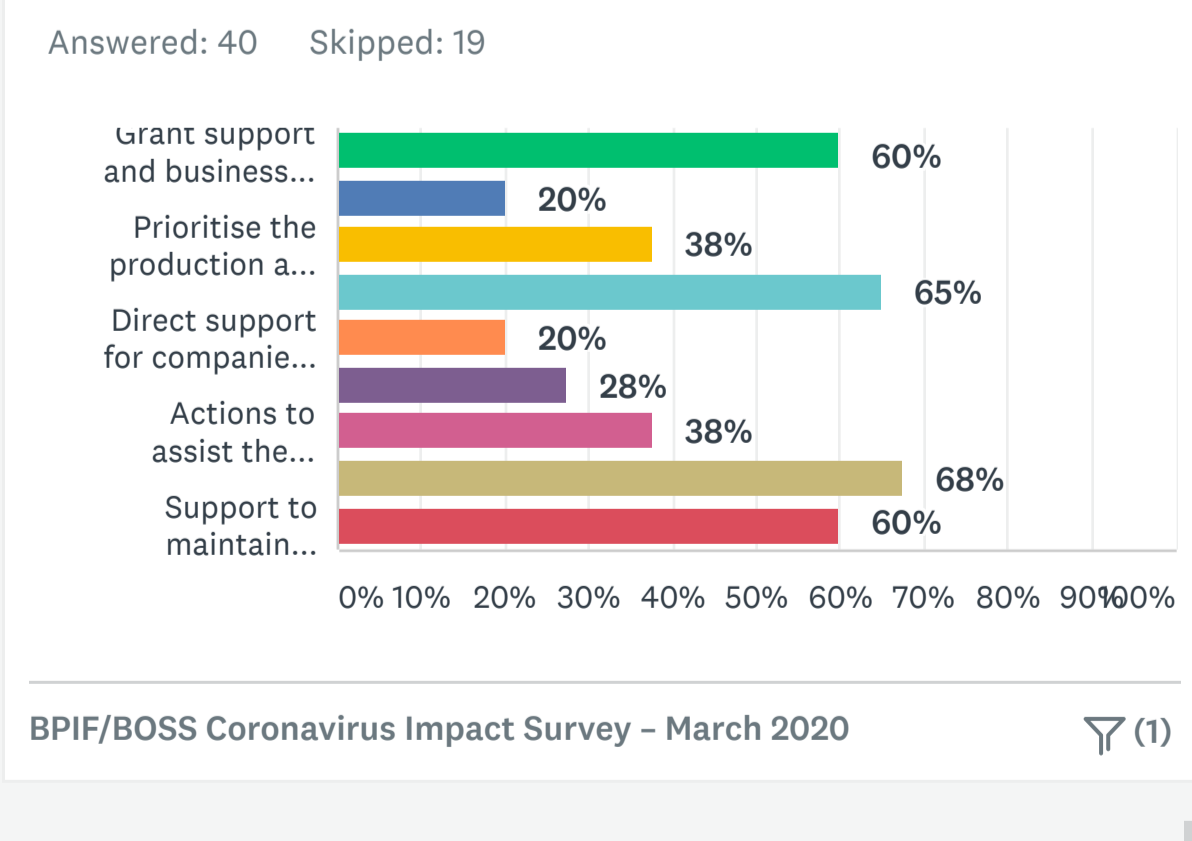
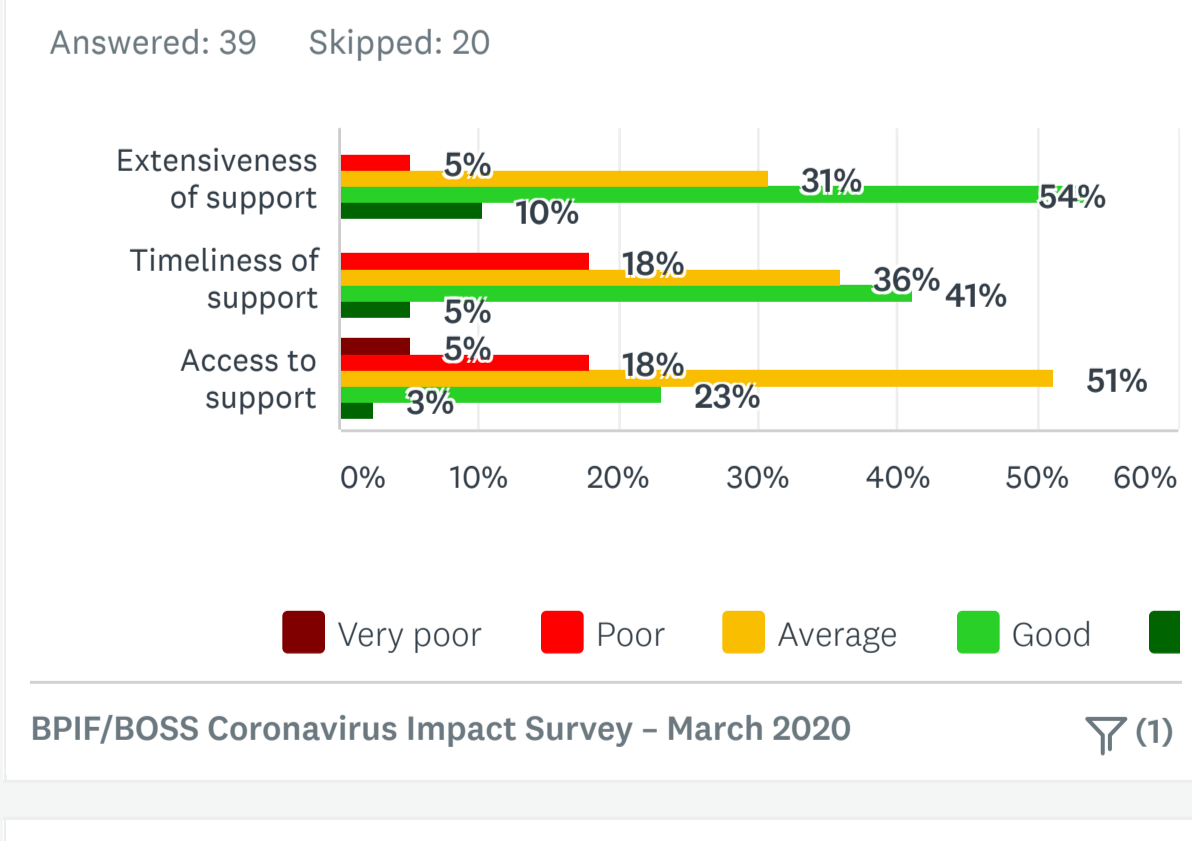
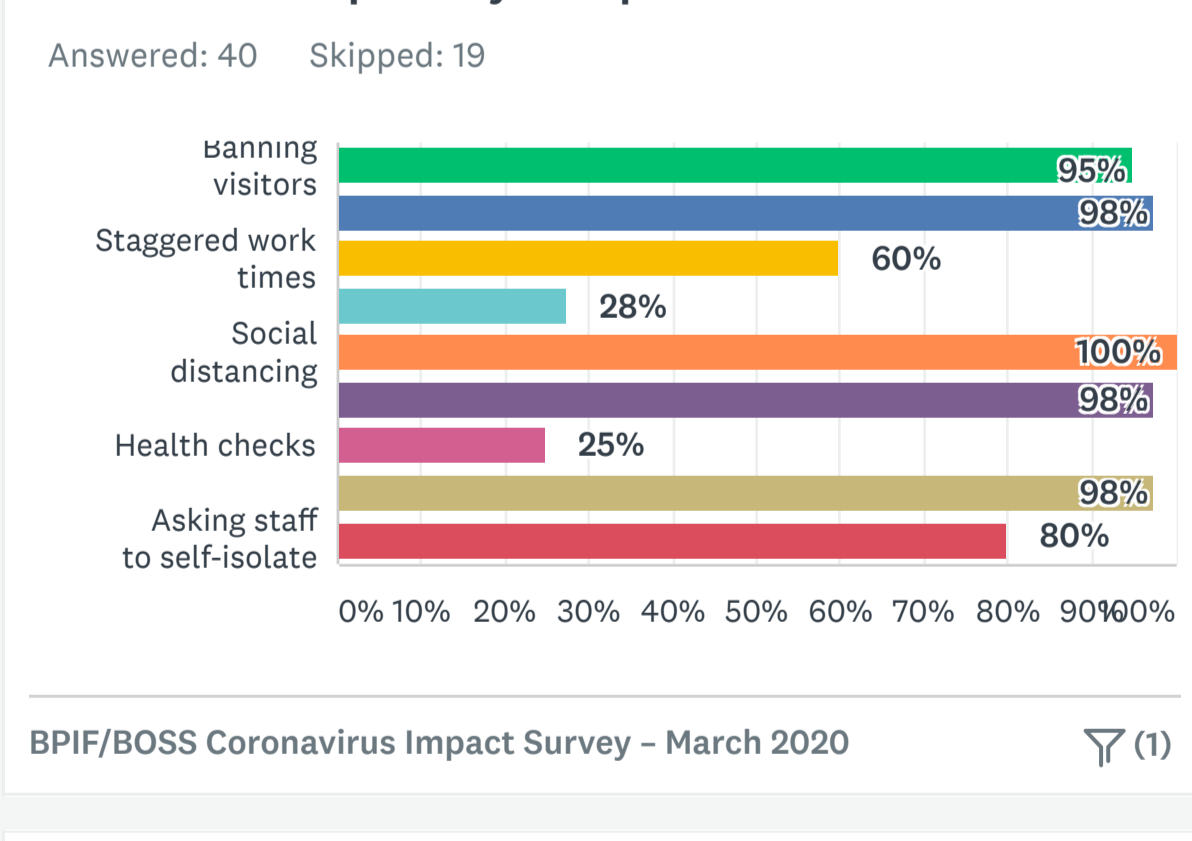
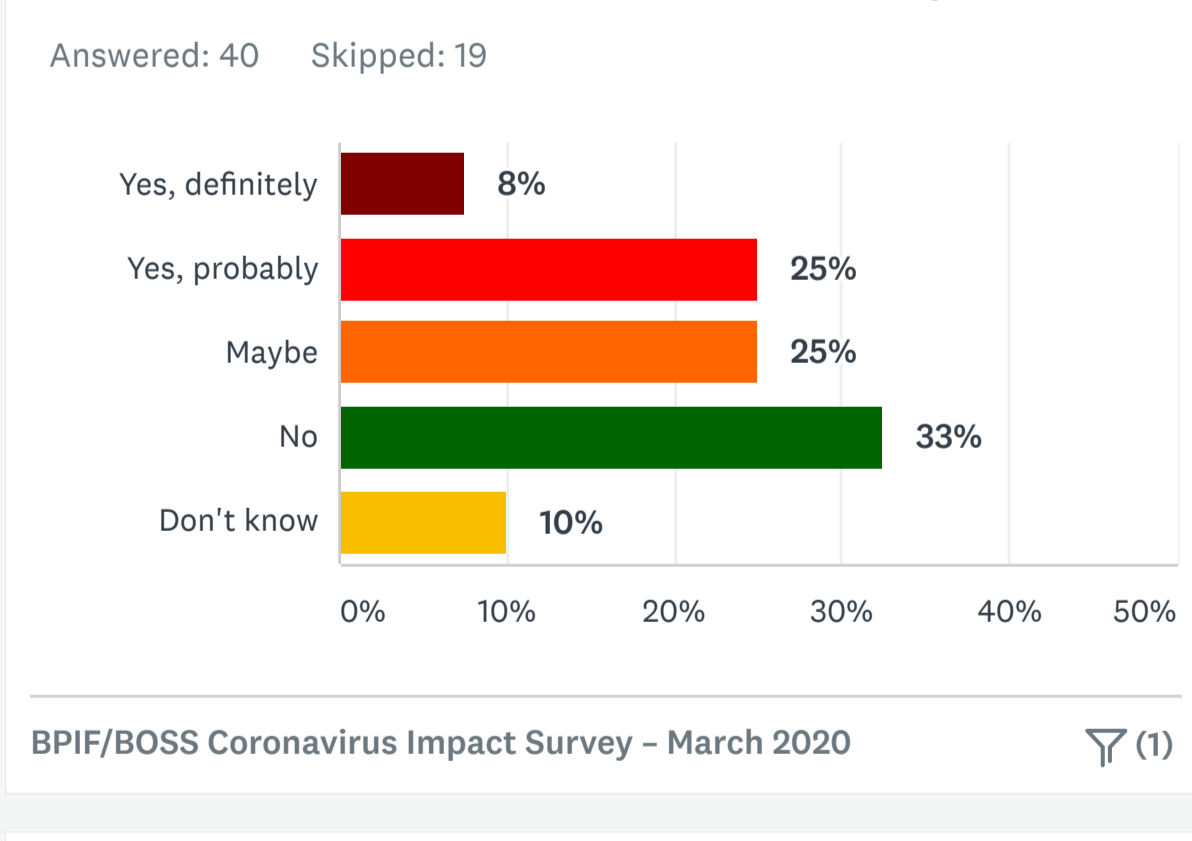
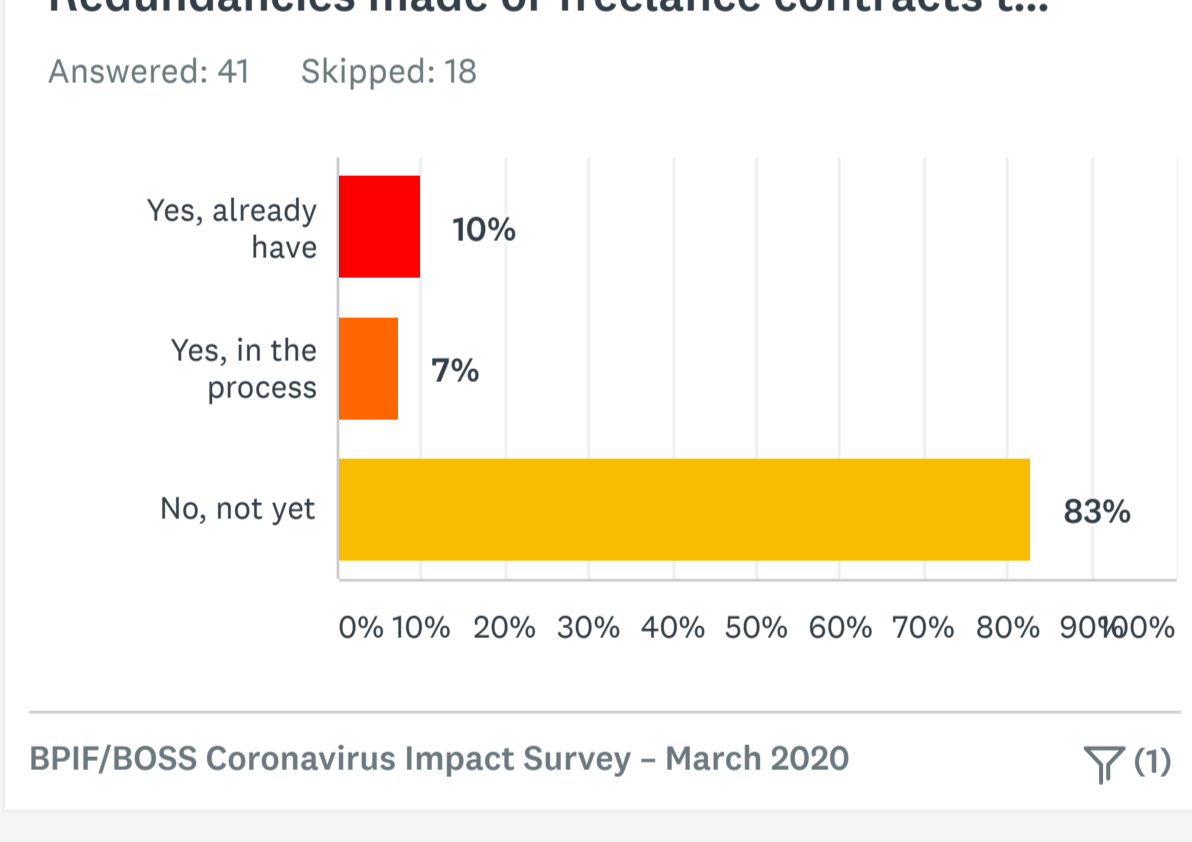
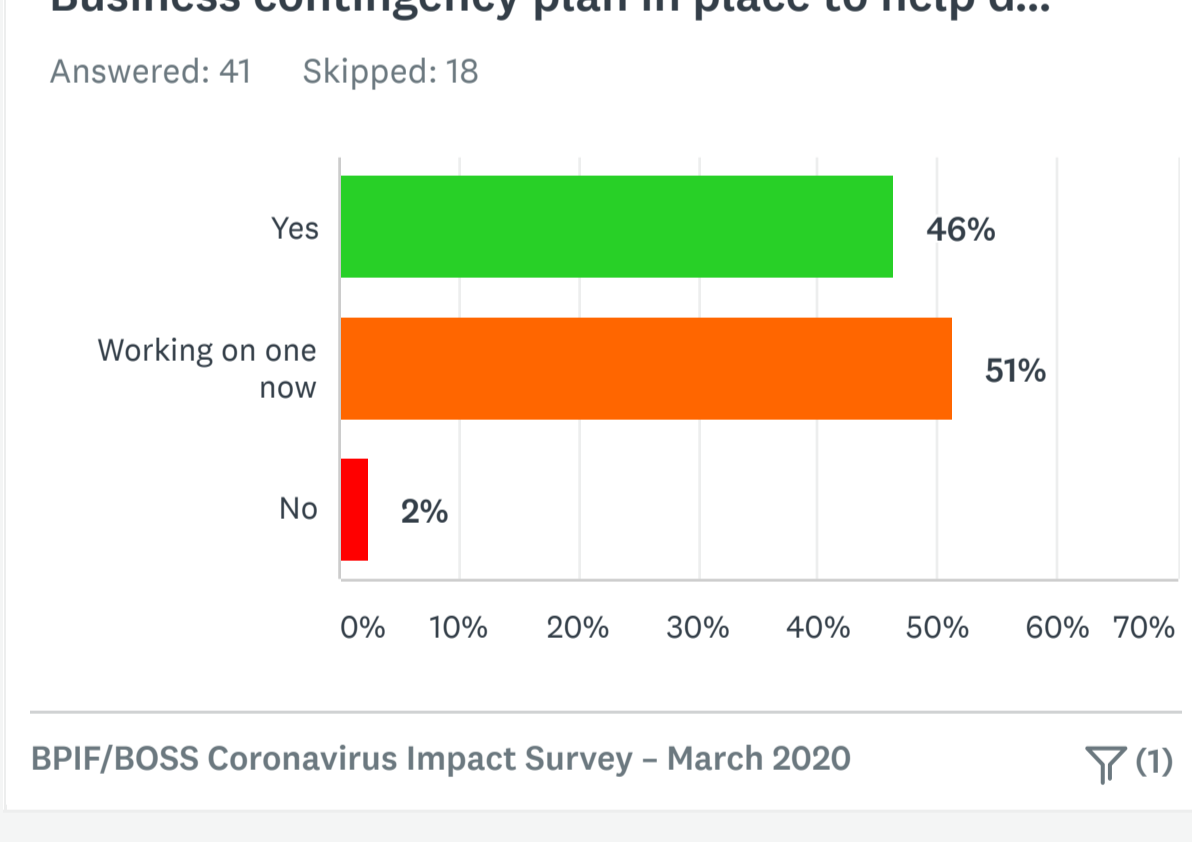
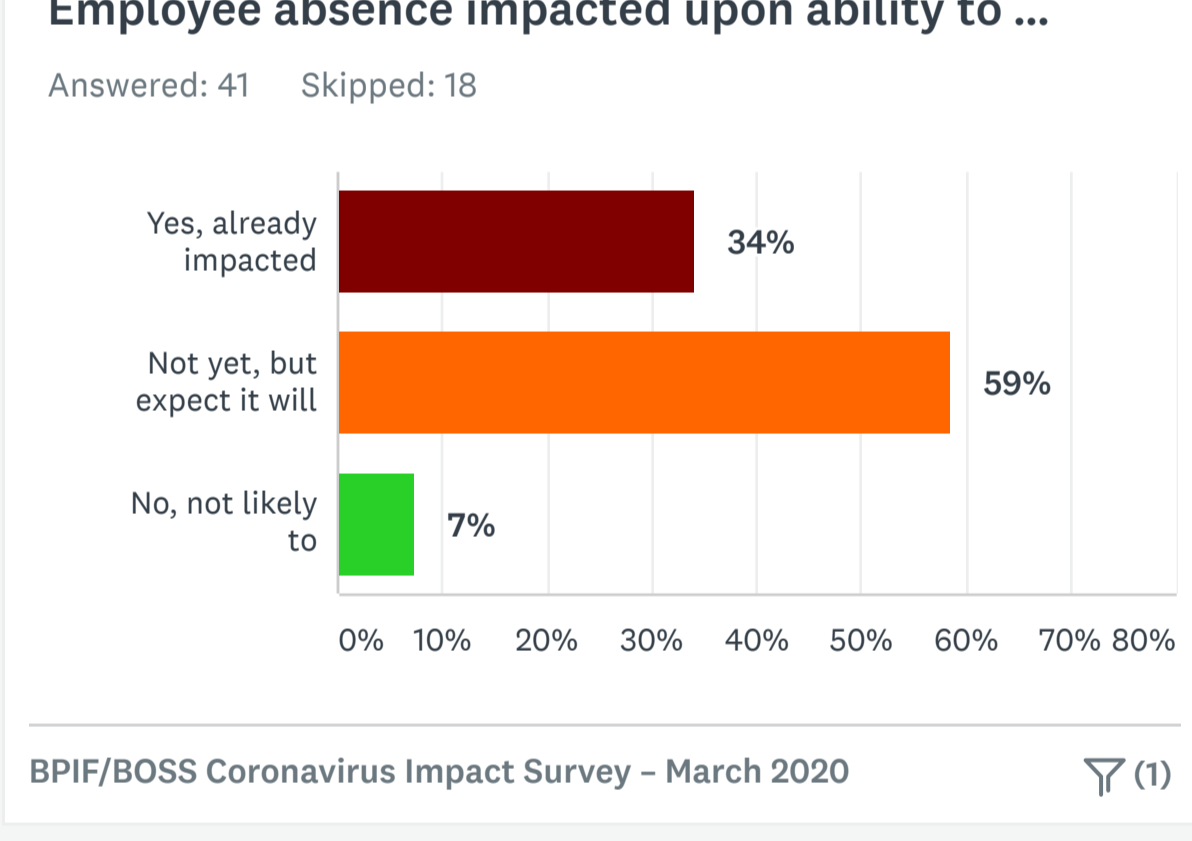
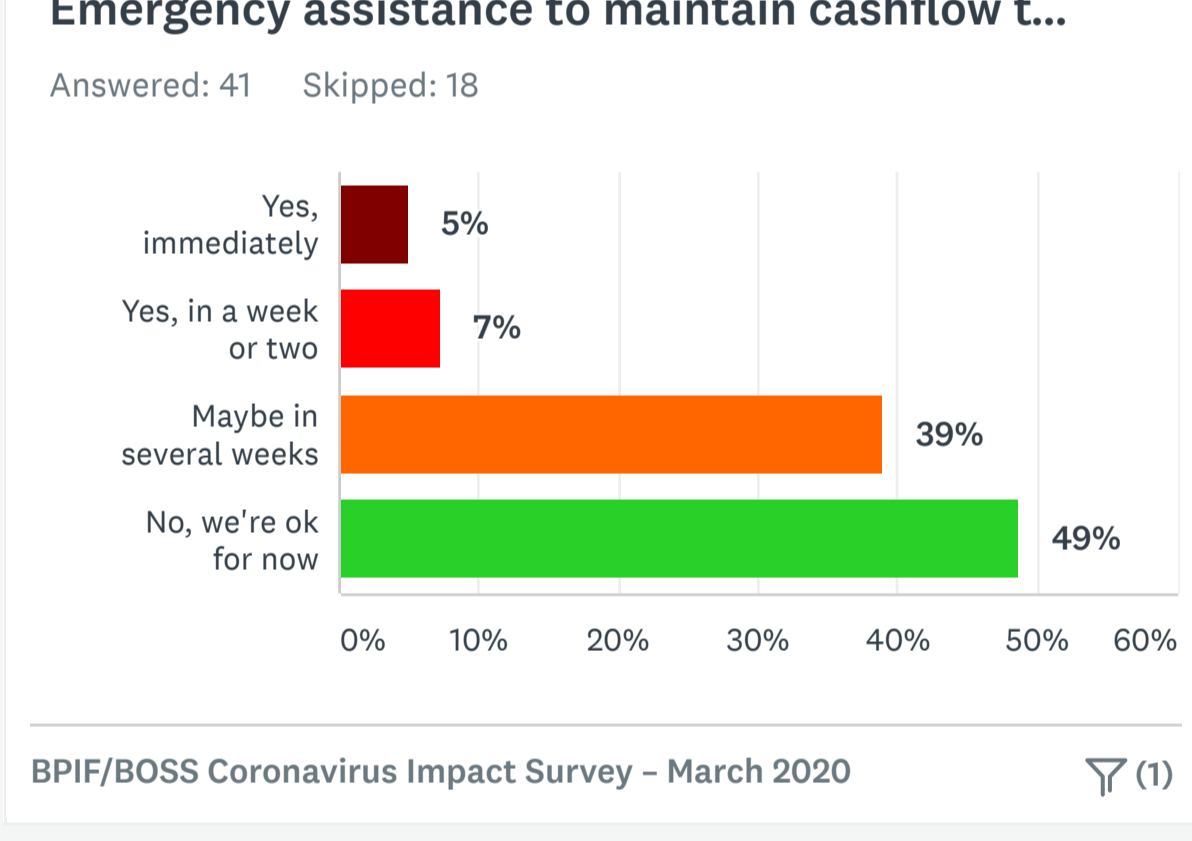
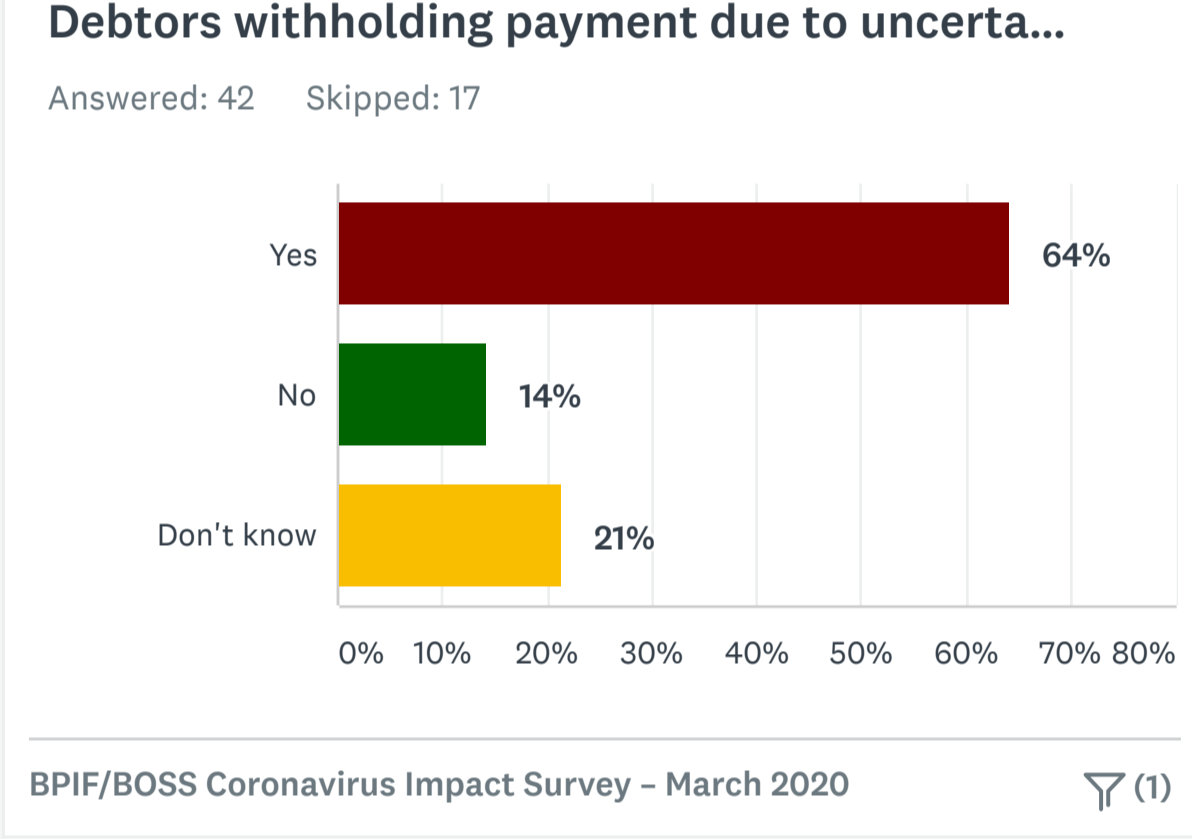
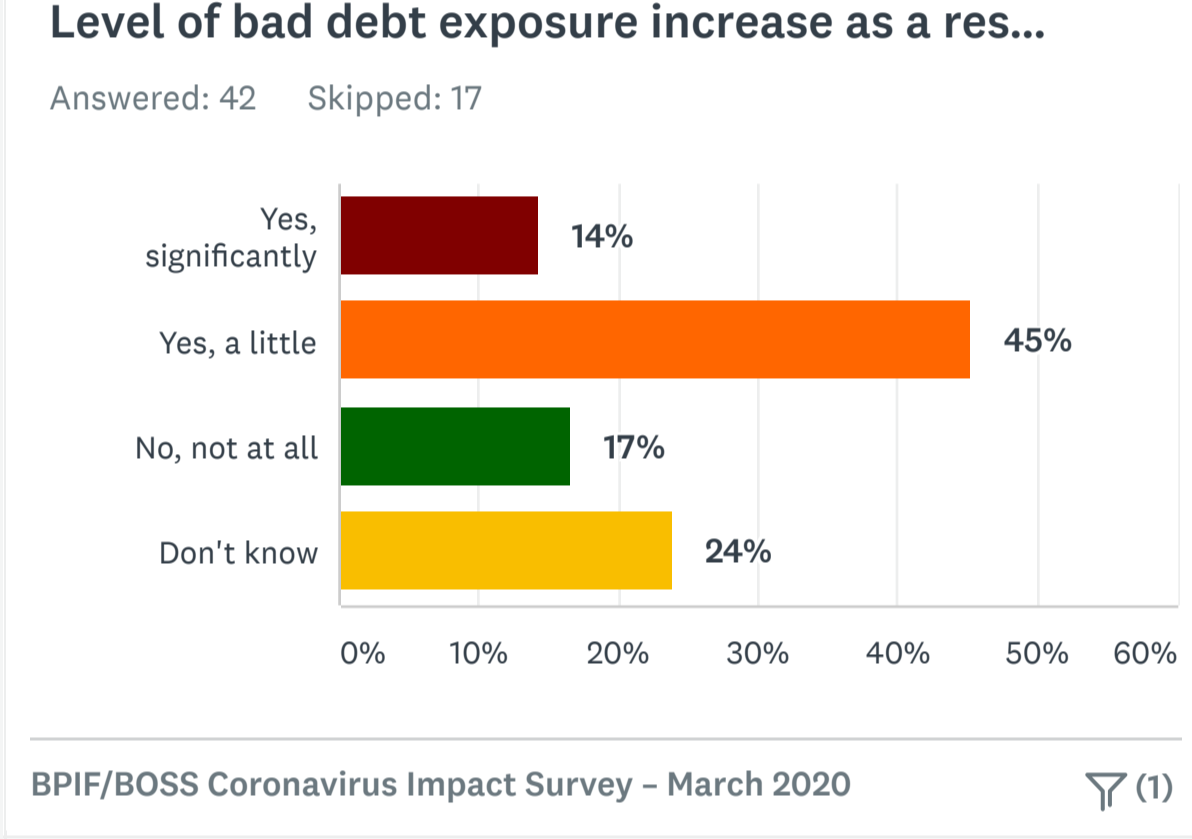
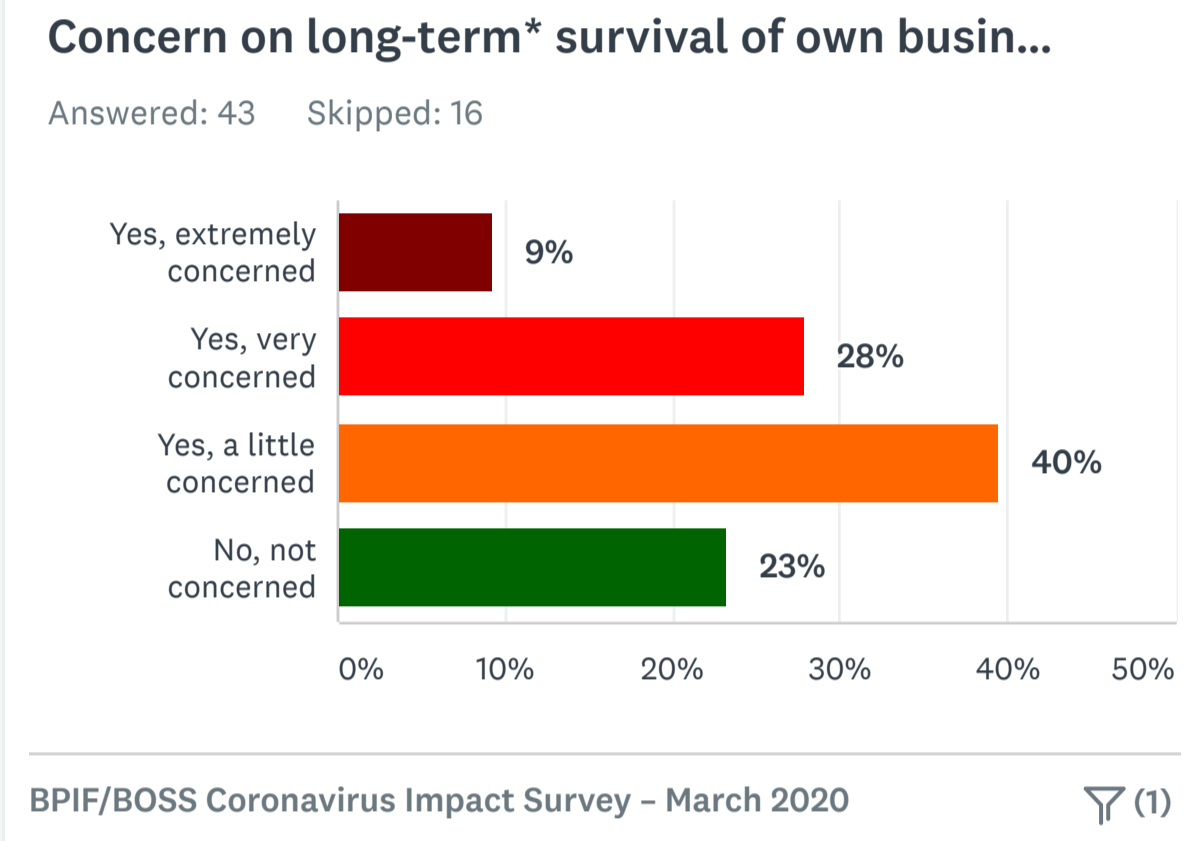
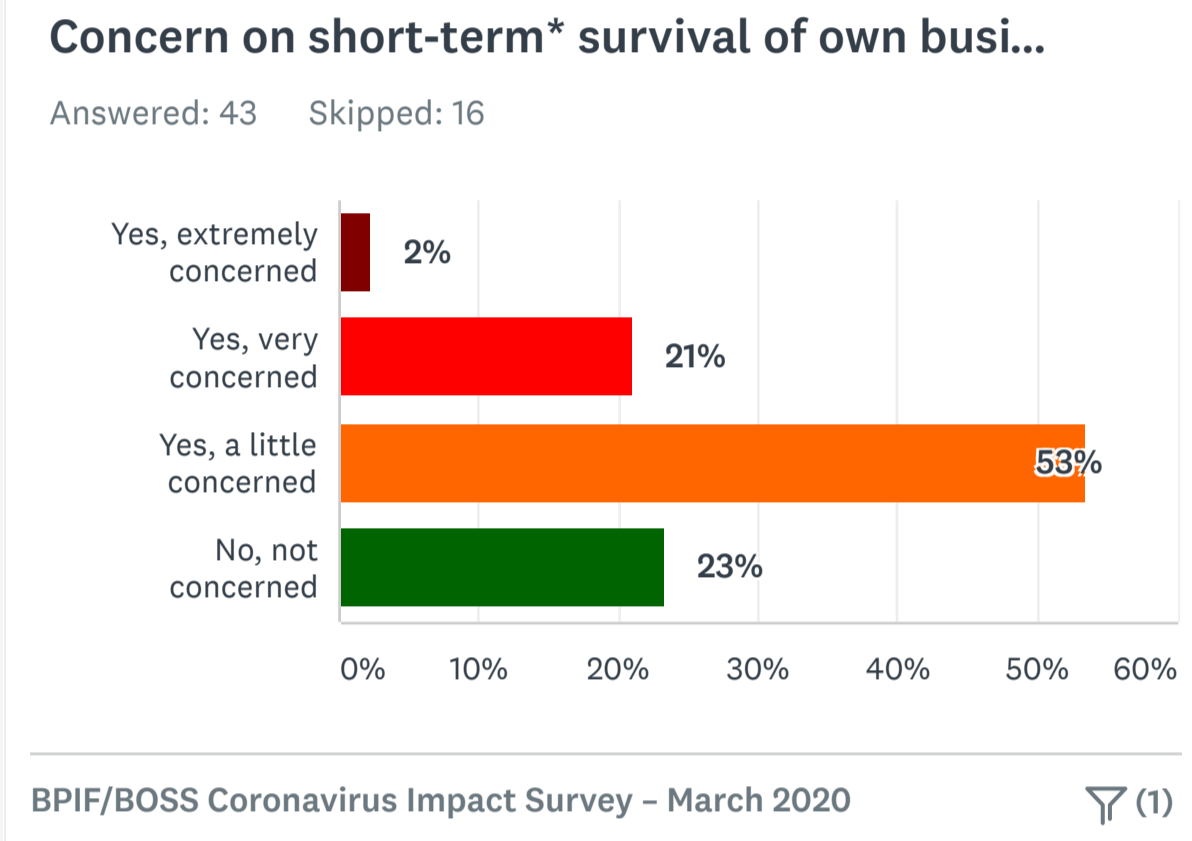
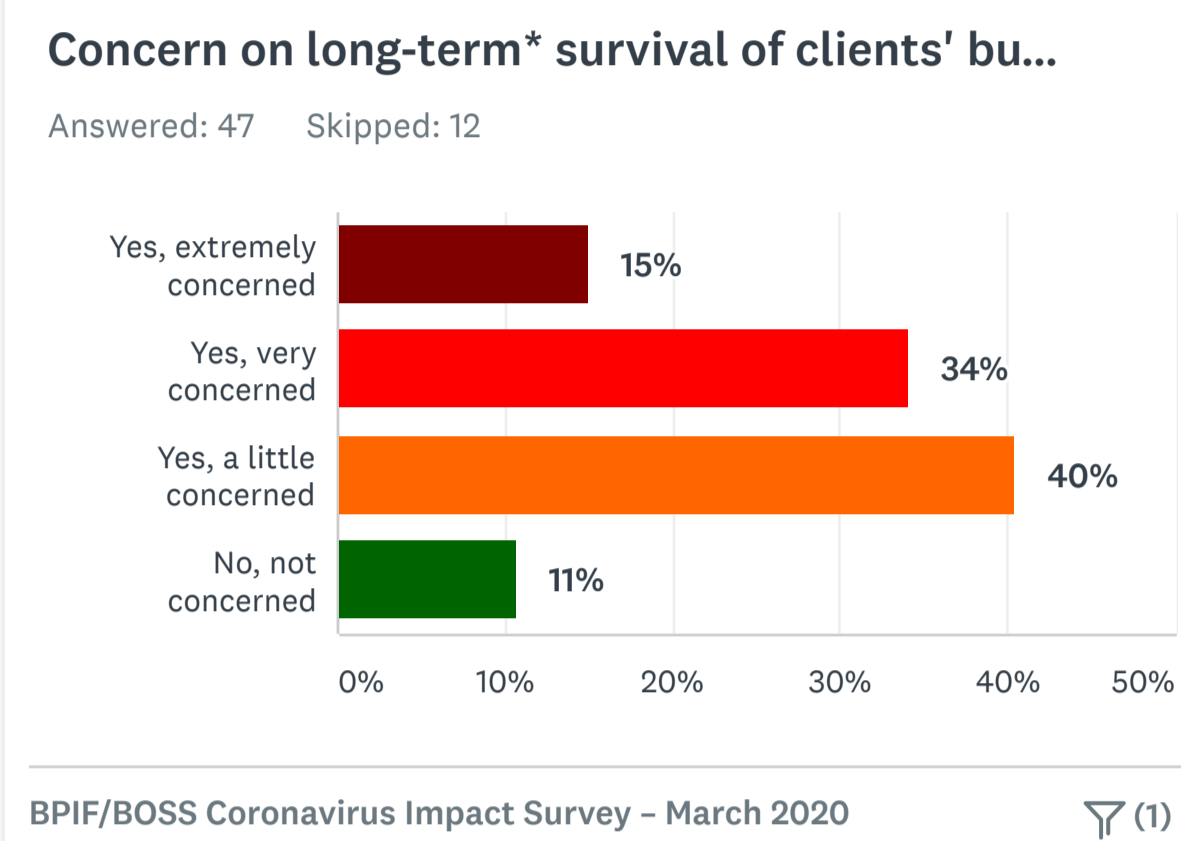
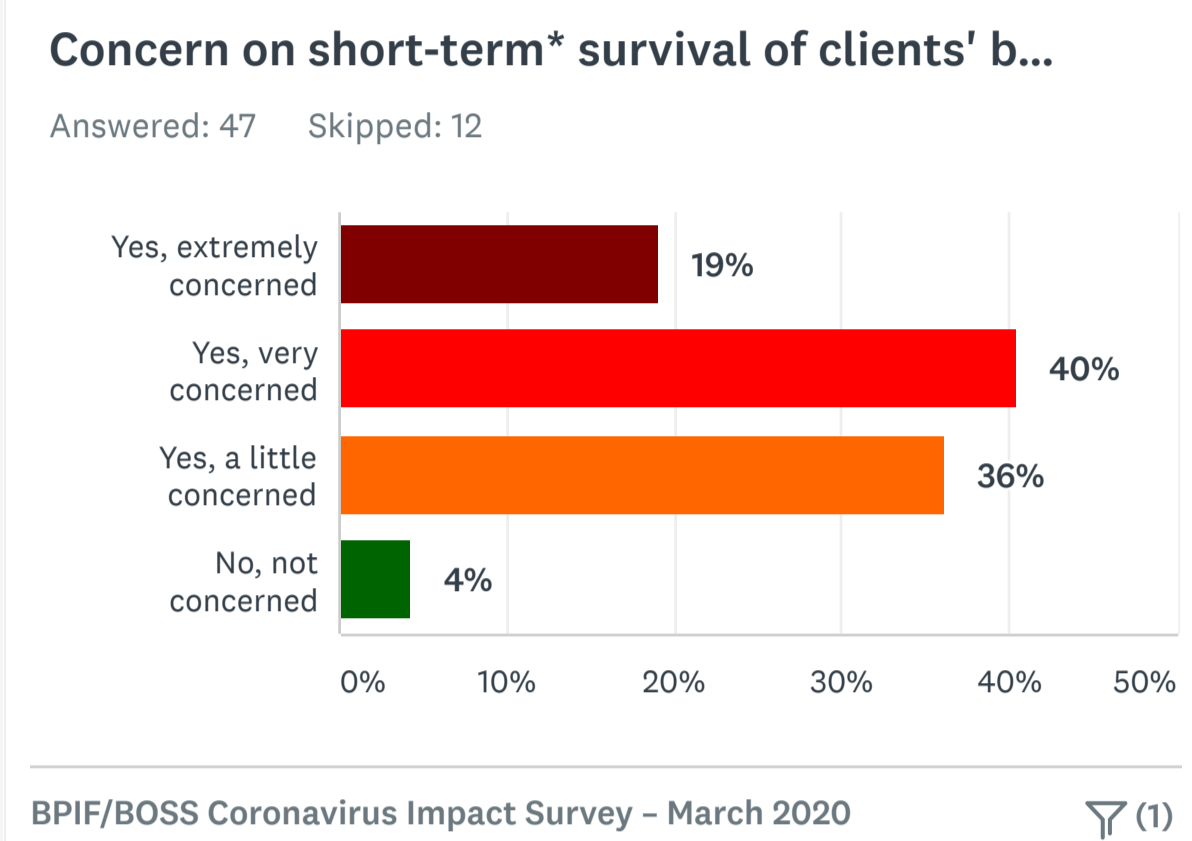
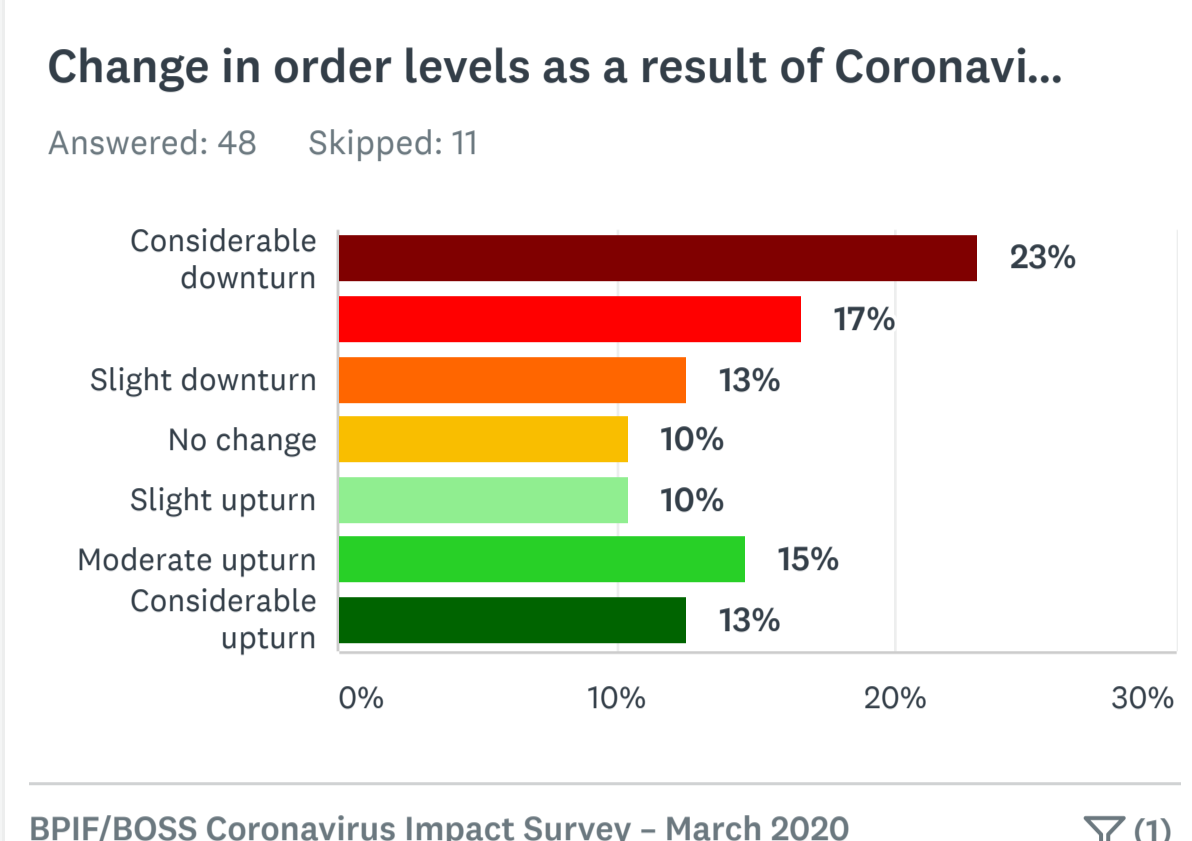
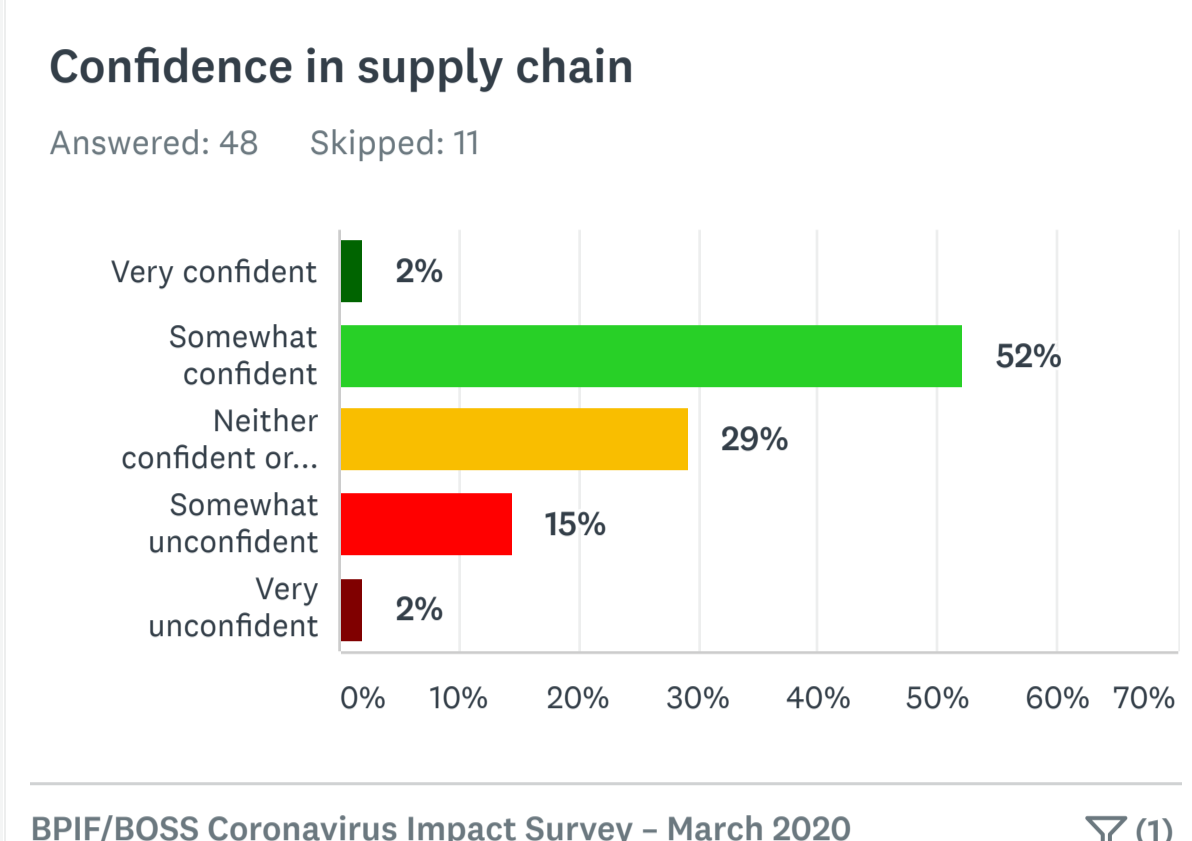
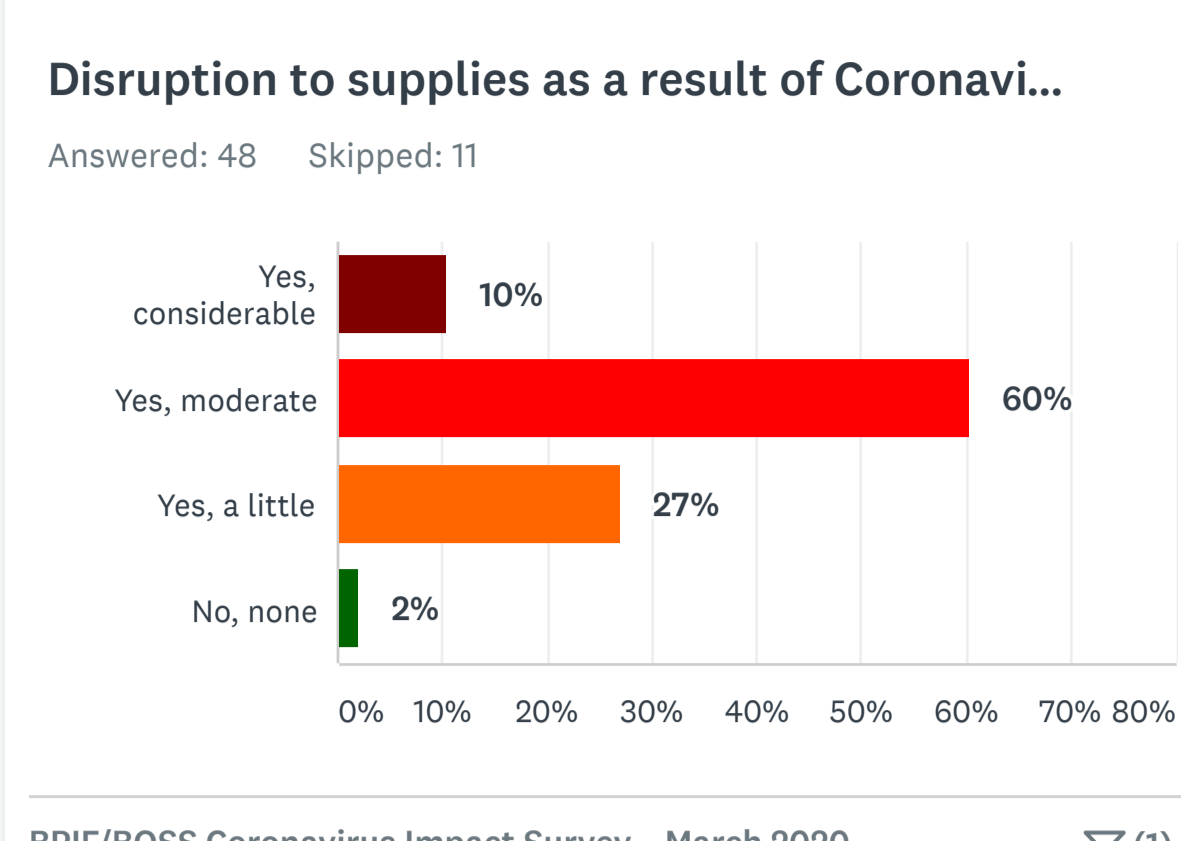
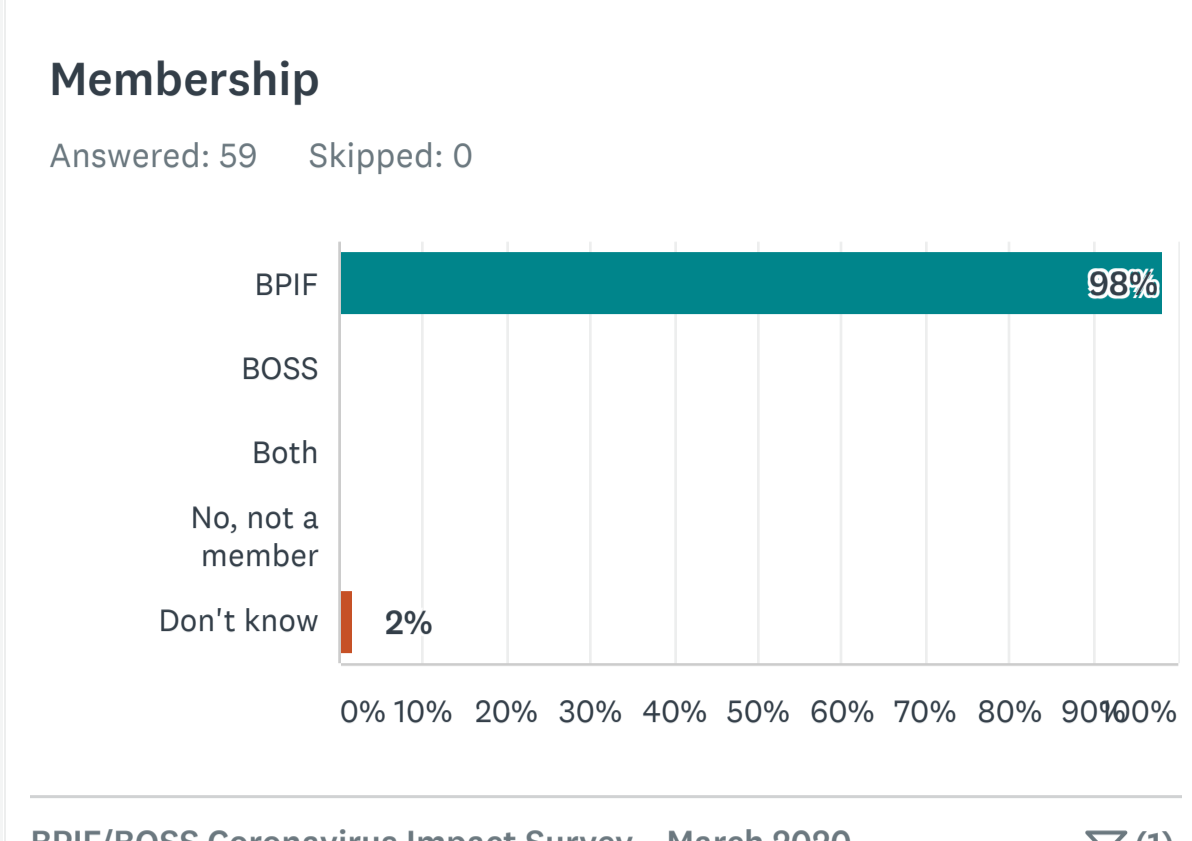
Not all question responses could be represented in this dashboard format:

Average change in order levels: -18%
